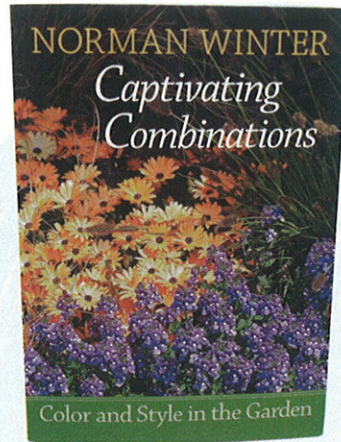


Yoknapatawpha Images and Voices: A Photographic Study of Faulkner's County

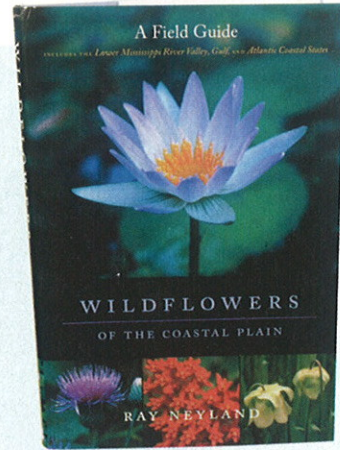

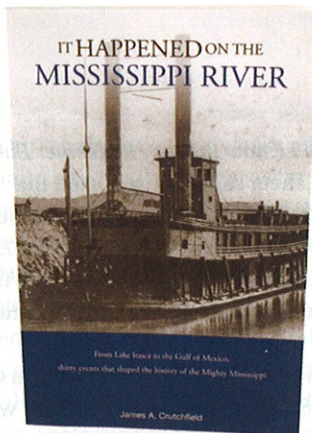

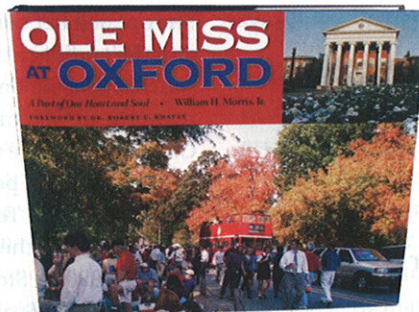

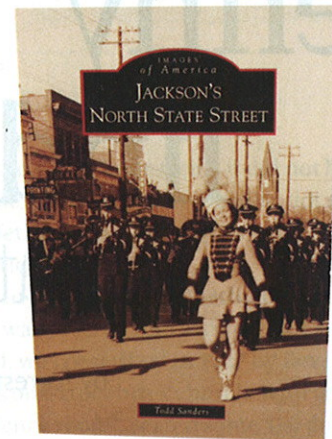
